## **Eco-Schools International**

### **Eco-Schools Programme**

Our primary aim regarding the Eco-Schools scheme is to combine learning and action for the improvement of the environmental performance of Eco-Schools.

The programme is administered by TIDY Northern Ireland, an environmental charity in Northern Ireland, and is now also being implemented throughout the world with schools in Europe, Africa, North America, South America, Oceania and Asia.

Northern Ireland has 234 current Green Flag Schools (a further 92 schools have had Green Flags which are now lapsed). Locally we now have around 1100 schools registered which is about 92% of schools in Northern Ireland. This equates to around 290,000 pupils involved in the Programme. There are 58 countries and about 18 million students involved in the Eco-Schools Programme worldwide.

This is an opportunity to get involved with a community of schools intent on improving environmental performance.

#### **About FEE**

The Foundation for Environmental Education (FEE) is a non-governmental, non-profit organisation promoting sustainable development through environmental education (formal school education, training of staff and general awareness raising).

FEE is an international umbrella organisation with one national member organisation per country representing FEE on the national level and in charge of implementing FEE programmes nationally. FEE has members in over 68 countries worldwide.

FEE is mainly active through its five environmental education programmes: Blue Flag, Eco-Schools, Young Reporters on the Environment, Learning about Forests and Green Key.

## Northern Ireland Landscape Charter

THIS IS A CALL TO ACTION FOR ALL WHO CARE ABOUT THE PLACES WE ENJOY AND VALUE. SIGN UP AND SEND THIS ON TO YOUR FRIENDS TO DO THE SAME.

It is easy and takes two minutes.....

Look at Northern Ireland's new Landscape Charter on <a href="http://www.doeni.gov.uk/niea/land-home/landscape">http://www.doeni.gov.uk/niea/land-home/landscape</a> home.htm

Then sign up by simply emailing nilandscapecharter@doeni.gov. uk with your name and occupation. You can email your name as an individual or on behalf of an organisation, voluntary or otherwise and even include a list of names of others who have given you their support.

If you wish you can also email the names of any places or landscapes anywhere in Northern Ireland that matter particularly to you, saying briefly why. What you say may even prompt those places or landscapes to be celebrated in the next version of the Charter to help them be valued even more.

Remember, the European Landscape Convention (ELC) entered into force in the UK in March 2007. It is a requirement of member states to bring forward plans and policies in order to identify, protect and enhance **all landscapes** (not just designated or remarkable areas but degraded and everyday landscapes as well). As the draft and entirely voluntary NI Landscape Charter states "It is not simply about landscape as biodiversity or ecology. It's not only concerned with countryside or matters of heritage. It addresses the entire package, values and

memories, the experience we have of place." .....so you could equally mention your back yard or the places you take the dog for a walk as the Mountains of Mourne or the Giant's Causeway.

Names received will remain confidential and not put to any other use whatsoever. There is absolutely no fear of spamming, follow up emails or people being pestered.

   The object of the game is to sort unwanted items into the relevant reuse or recycling facilities. None of these items should be sent to landfill. This is a fun and competitive way to learn about the 3 Rs (Reduce-Reuse-Recycle)

- Bin Run; this game is free for everyone but the competition is only open to schools in Belfast City Council area.
